



Pacific Marten Research - Haida Gwaii 2018 Winter Research Field Assistant

Preference will be given to applicants of Haida ancestry and local applicants, defined as those who have resided on Haida Gwaii for a minimum of 12 consecutive months prior to application date.

Duties:

Assist UNBC graduate research candidate in all aspects of non-invasive field surveys of Pacific marten (*Martes caurina*) on Graham Island, including:

- remote wildlife camera trap installation, monitoring and photo data capture
- hair snare trap construction and deployment
- hair sample collection and processing
- site-level habitat data collection
- data entry

Terms of Employment:

- 12 weeks, January 8 to March 30, 2018; possible 4-week extension to April 27, 2018.
- 35 hours per week, 7 hour office days, 10 hour field days
- Wage \$1,602.33 bi-weekly

The project is collaboratively run by the B.C. Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations (FLRNO), the University of Northern British Columbia, and the B.C. Ministry of Environment (MOE). The successful applicant will be employed under the administrative supervision of the Haida Gwaii Natural Resource District (including Safety); mentored by FLNRO, MOE and UNBC research scientists; and under the field supervision of the UNBC graduate research candidate.
